### DOG REGISTRATIONS FEES

Known dog owners in the Gore District will receive registration forms for the 2017/18 year in the next few weeks. The fees for the coming financial year, adopted by the Council, are:

Additional fee for impounding or releasing dogs at weekends, public holidays or outside the Council's office hours	\$50

Dog owners have until 5.00pm on Friday 18 August to register their dogs and avoid a late registration fee. Dogs not registered by Friday 15 September will incur an infringement notice.
