

Road closures

Hokonui Moonshine Fest

Norfolk Street, from Hokonui Drive to Ordsal Street, will be closed from Friday 15 February to Sunday 17 February

Mataura River Day

River Terrace will be closed on Sunday 24 February, from 8.00am to 8.00pm, for the On the Fly Mataura River Day.

Drag racing

The following streets will be closed on Sunday 24 February from 7.30am to 7.00pm for the Cobra Hot Rod & Custom Car Club 1/8th mile drag racing:

- Woolwich Street, from the Oxford/Huron intersection to Boundary Road, and
- Maitland Street, from Hamilton St to intersection with Woolwich Street

Detours will be available via Hamilton Street and Boundary Road.

Building demolition

Bowler Avenue will be closed from the intersection with Fairfield Street to Main Street, from Saturday 23 February to Tuesday 26 February, to allow for the demolition of a building.

Talbot Street work

Talbot Street will be intermittently closed from Monday 11 February to Wednesday 13 February to allow for work to improve sight distances.

Reception centralisation

The Council is centralising reception at the main administration building, in Bowler Avenue, to the ground floor following a successful trial.

The four month trial, which involved the closure of the upstairs reception three days a week, was well received by customers. People were encouraged to make an appointment, which ensured staff were available and had all the information needed to respond to the inquiry quickly and effectively.

People are still urged to plan ahead to avoid a wasted visit.

The centralisation is effective from **Monday 4 February**. All customers will need to report to the ground floor reception even if they have an appointment with a staff member on the first floor.
