We just want to say thanks to the 534 people who have downloaded our new app Antenno. We have been overwhelmed by the fantastic response, which has put the Gore District Council second in New Zealand, in terms of downloads per capita.

We know from the number of 'thanks' we get, that our Antenno users appreciate notifications about water shutdowns, the Mataura River bathing water tests and road closures. The recycling and rubbish collection reminders are a favourite as well.

We are also getting more information about what's happening around the District. There have been 78 reports in the last 30 days about a wide range of things, such as graffiti, street lighting, and water leaks.

What's great is that 59% of the reports have one or more photos attached, which is very helpful for our staff.

A lot of our notifications are being shared. However, if you live in the Gore District don't rely on getting important information second hand – download Antenno today from the App Store or Google Play. You will find all the details about Antenno on our website www.goredc.govt.nz

Property file requests now online

Property files provide useful and important information if you are considering buying a property, building a house or making any changes to a property.

A property file is likely to contain:

- Building Consents
- Building plans
- Code of compliance certificates
- Certificate of acceptance documents
- As-built plans (eg: internal wastewater and stormwater plans)
- Land use consents

Property files may be viewed at the Council's office (29 Bowler Avenue, Gore) during office hours. There is no charge. You can request to view a property file by filling in the online form. There is a link under Do It Online.

If you lodge a request before 11.00am, the file will be available for viewing at 1.00pm that day. If you submit your request after 11.00am, the files will be available after 1.00pm the following business day.
