

## Road closures

### Falconer Road

Falconer Road will be closed to through traffic from Monday 23 September until Saturday 30 November, depending on the weather.

The closure is to allow for a major upgrade, which includes sealing the entire length of the road, earthworks, underground drainage and access ways.

There will be restricted access for residents and to businesses via Waiau Street, including access to Transport Repairs. Traffic management will be in place throughout the construction period.

### Bowmar Road

There will be disruptions to traffic flow on Bowmar Road, between Charlton Road and the Charlton Park cemetery, from Monday 30 September to Friday 18 October. This is due to the felling of a stand of large macrocarpa trees.

Motorists should also expect temporary road closures. Our contractor is working with funeral directors to ensure the road is open for funerals.

### Culling Terrace wastewater renewal

Our 3 Waters team is renewing the wastewater network in Culling Terrace, Matura. Work will start on Monday 23 September and take until the end of October (about six weeks).

To ensure public and staff safety, there will be traffic lights at the top and bottom of Culling Terrace for the duration of work. Motorists can expect delays.

There will be no disruption to water or wastewater supplies for residents. Thank you for your understanding.

### Voting opens in Council elections

Gore District voters will be able to cast their votes in the 2019 local council elections from this weekend.

Three years ago 59.4% of eligible voters in the District had their say. This was up 17.7% on 2013, giving the District the biggest increase in New Zealand across metropolitan, provincial and rural councils.

This year there are contested seats in the Gore ward, District at-large, and Matura Community Board.

Voting papers are expected to be delivered to all registered voters by next Wednesday (25 September).

Voting papers must be received by the Council before midday on Election Day, 12 October 2019.
