With only eight days until the deadline for dog registrations, we've had 1980 dogs get their new blue tags.

Keeping your dog's registration up to date doesn't only mean they can be quickly traced if they go walk about.

It also provides us with some fascinating stats – like the most popular breed in the District is Collie (no surprises there), closely followed by Labrador.

Last year there were 3446 dogs registered in the Gore District so there's still quite a few registration papers to come in. Owners have until Friday 14 August to avoid a 40% penalty.

Park Street Footpath Repairs

Motorists are asked to avoid Park Street, in north Gore, while our contractors are reconstructing faulty sections of footpath at various locations along the street.

The street will remain open. However, traffic will be reduced to one lane on occasion, which will cause delays. Work will be confined to one side of the street at a time.

We expect to be finished within two weeks.

Wigan Street Wastewater Main Renewal

There will be traffic restrictions in Wigan Street, between Bury Street and Salford Street, during renewal of the wastewater main.

Our 3Waters team will have a single lane open for one way traffic. However, to prevent any congestion, we would appreciate it if through traffic avoided the area. The street is open to residents.
