

Dog Registration Final Notice

An important notice for dog owners. If your dog is still unregistered, this is a final notice. Register your dog by Thursday 5 November to avoid a \$300 fine. Registrations for 2020/21 were due on Friday 14 August. We have sent reminder notices and letters to people who still haven't registered their dogs, as well as contacting them directly. Now is the last chance.

Owners of dogs unregistered after 5 November will be issued with an infringement notice and be liable for a \$300 fine.

Pool and Spa Safety

With summer almost on our doorsteps many of you might be considering installing a swimming pool or spa pool on your property. Before you do, there's a few important things you need to know to make your pool safe for everyone.

Access must be restricted to pools capable of holding water to a depth of at least 40cm. This includes inflatable pools you may have in storage or buy on the spur of the moment on a hot weekend.

The most common way to restrict access is to have a fence around the pool. Any fences (or other barriers) must:

- Restrict access by unattended children under five years old.
- Not have any permanent fixtures that could potentially assist climbing.
- Have self-closing gates, which open away from the pool area.
- Not have a latch readily accessible to children under five years old.
- Have gates that emit an audible warning if they are not self-closing.

It's the Council's job to maintain a register of pools and spas in our District, and to check them every three years to make sure they meet legislative requirements.

Road Closure Notification



PROPOSAL TO CLOSE PART OF SH1 & SH94 GORE TO ORDINARY VEHICULAR TRAFFIC

PURSUANT to the Transport (Vehicular Traffic Road Closure) Regulations 1965 notice is hereby given that Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency and Gore District Council, for the purpose of the Gore Santa Parade & Christmas in the Park event, propose to close the following streets to ordinary vehicular traffic for the period indicated hereunder.

Streets proposed to be closed to ordinary vehicular traffic:

State Highway: Medway Street Gore (SH1) from River Street to Hokonui Drive; Main Street Gore (SH1) from the roundabout at Hokonui Drive (SH94) to the roundabout at Hyde Street/Crombie Street intersection with Main Street.

Local Roads: Ordsal Street from Avon Street to Medway Street; Irwell Street from Fairfield Street to Ardwick Street.

During the proposed period of closure the following provision will be made for ordinary vehicular traffic which would otherwise use the streets:

Detour via Heavy Truch Bypass: SH1/Hyde Street/River Street and Norfolk Street/Richmond Street/Avon Street/SH94.

Period of proposed closure: Sunday, 13 December 2020 between the hours of 11.00am - 1.00pm. Irwell Street closed 11.00am - 6.00pm.

Any person objecting to the proposal is called upon to lodge notice of their objection and grounds thereof in writing before 5.00pm, 13 November 2020 at the office of Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency, Level 2, AA Building, 450 Moray Place, PO Box 5245, Dunedin 9058.
