GRAVEL TRIAL PROVES SUCCESSFUL

A recent trial of five different gravels has produced some promising results and could see a new type of gravel being used on the District's roads.

The Council's roading team carried out the six-week trial on Gilchrist Road, near Waikaka Valley. It involved laying 100m long sections with about 40 cubic metres of gravel from five sources. There was also a control section.

Roading Officer Paul Williamson said the aim was to see if there were better options for the District's gravel roads than the riverbed gravel used in the past.

"We were looking for something more robust, cost effective and also safer for motorists. About 11,000 cubic metres of gravel is put on the

District's roads each year, so getting the right mix is important."

During the trial the sections were regularly inspected for such things as potholing, rutting, and dust.

Three of the five trial gravels performed exceptionally well, Mr Williamson said. One had clay properties, which are particularly beneficial.

"When you crush gravel with clay properties you get a product that binds and holds its shape."

This creates a gravel road surface that is safer, more comfortable to drive on, and doesn't pothole as quickly.

The Council is presently working through the logistics of using the new gravel type across the roading network.

NEW RULES FOR MANAGING FOOD SAFETY

If you make cheese rolls to fundraise or operate a B&B, then the new food safety rules may apply to you.

The rules came into effect at the start of this month, however, there is a three year transition period for existing food businesses.

The Council's senior Regulatory Officer Frances Shepherd said about 80 businesses in the Gore District fall into the transition period.

"We will work with these businesses and any new ones to make sure the roll out of the new regulations is as smooth as possible."

The Food Act 2014 takes a new approach to managing food safety and recognises

that not all businesses are the same, Mrs Shepherd said.

One of the features is a sliding scale where businesses that are higher risk, from a food safety point of view, will operate under more stringent food safety requirements than a lower-risk business.

Mrs Shepherd said she appreciates it may appear a bit confusing to start with, but the Ministry for Primary Industries has several excellent online tools to help people.
