Subject: Notice of meeting to allocate funding

Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the Rural Halls and Domains Sub-Committee will be held on Tuesday 3 October 2023 following the conclusion of the Policy and Regulatory Committee meeting, in meeting room 4 (downstairs), civic administration building.

The purpose of the meeting is to consider one application received for funding assistance, as follows:

Organisation Waikaka Centennial Hall Amount requested \$2,775

An amount of \$25,319, made up of the annual grant of \$18,419 in addition to the \$6,900 carried forward from 2022, (exclusive of GST) is available for distribution this year.

Attached is information setting out the scheme criteria, a table showing previous allocations to applicants in recent years and a copy of the 2023 application. Last year's sole recipient, the Kaiwera Recreation Reserve and Hall Society, has advised it is still waiting on a contractor to complete the work.

Criteria for the Allocation of Rural Halls and Domains Grants

The total pool of monetary grants available for allocation to rural halls and domain organisations by the Council is set on an annual basis.

Applications for monetary grants are considered using the following criteria:

- 1. The fund is confined to rural halls and domains domiciled in the rural rating area of the Gore District. For the avoidance of doubt, halls and domains in the urban communities of Gore and Mataura are not eligible for funding.
- 2. The extent to which they support community outcomes as set out in the Long Term Plan and the Annual Plan.
- 3. The application being made by a bona fide community or non profit organisation.
- 4. The applicant being able to demonstrate clearly the need for its service.
- 5. The applicant being able to identify the likely Gore District community to benefit from the services, activities or projects to be funded. In identifying beneficiaries the organisation needs to demonstrate its relevance and relationship with these beneficiaries.
- 6. The Council reserving the right to not fund projects or initiatives that are considered the responsibility of central Government.
- 7. The applicant furnishing the Council with its latest set of annual accounts.

Potentially earthquake-prone building (or part) - EPB 146



Under the Building Act 2004 (the Building Act), the Council is required to identify potentially earthquake-prone buildings (or parts of buildings) by applying the Earthquake-prone Building Methodology (EPB Methodology) within the Gore District.

You are receiving this letter because our records show that you are the current owner of the above building. Please advise the Council if this is not the case.

This building (or part) has been identified as a potentially earthquake-prone building using the EPB Methodology.

The EPB Methodology requires buildings to be identified as potentially earthquake prone if they fall within a specific category of building type, known as profile categories. This building has been profiled as falling within the following category:

A. Unreinforced masonry building

As the building owner, you now have until 23 May 2024 to provide to the Council, either:

- An engineering assessment of the building (or a previous assessment) undertaken by a suitably qualified structural engineer that complies with the requirements of the EPB Methodology. This will be used to determine if the building is earthquake prone or not.
- Evidence of a factual error in the basis on which the Council has identified this building as potentially earthquake prone.
- 3. Notification that you do not intend to provide an engineering assessment of the building.

If you are unable to meet the due date for providing the engineering assessment (for example, because of a shortage of people qualified to conduct engineering assessments), you can apply for a time extension of up to 12 months. You must apply for the extension no later than 23 March 2024. When applying for the extension please clearly explain your
