BASIN FENCES INSTALLED

The Council has just finished building fences around stormwater catchment basins in West Gore and Matai Ridge after people rasied concerns for children's safety when the basin were full of water.

Stormwater catchment basins, also known as infiltration basins, are relatively new for our urban areas. They capture stormwater during heavy rainfall and gradually release it into our pipelines, minimising the risk of the network being overwhelmed.

Last September, the basin on the corner of Elizabeth and Broughton streets became about two-thirds full of water during persistent, heavy rainfall. While the water drained away in about five hours, people were worried about the risk to children.

Following a risk assessment the Council decided to construct the fencing to address potential health and safety concerns. The Council agreed to a budget of

\$68,600 to fence both sites.

2024/25 FEES & CHARGES

Every year, we review our fees and charges to ensure they align with our neighbouring local authorities. We also consider whether the fees cover the cost of the services identified as having a strong component of user pays.

Areas where fees have increased include:

- Dog registration up \$5 (first increase in five years)
- Building consents up 28% to 36% to align with neighbouring councils and reflect actual costs
- Cemeteries up between 2% and 14% to reflect increased operational costs
- Gore Aquatic Centre average 9% increase due to increase in chemical costs for water treatment and cleaning

NO SPRAY REGISTER

Around September each year, the Council starts its roadside vegetation spraying.

Residents who do not want their roadside frontage sprayed need to apply to go on our No Spray Register by **Wednesday 31 July**.

Those already on the register will get a reminder letter closer to when we start spraying.

Anyone who wants to go on the register or has changed address can apply online *goredc.govt.nz/no-spray.*

Applicants need to provide us with a map of the no spray area and will need to make sure the area is kept free of weeds. Failure to do so will result in the area being removed from the register.
